Our Future: March for Abortion Access Rally Signs FAQ

You can pick up signs from us at the rally—we will have plenty!—but we love your handmade rally signs! Some guidelines on messaging for your social media posts and rally signs:

It's 2022. Let's avoid some of these pitfalls:

- Gendered language: The right to decide if, when, or how to have children is a human right, and a diverse range of people have had or will need abortion care. Trans, nonbinary, and gender nonconforming people get abortions, full stop. As Physicians for Reproductive Health puts it, "It costs us nothing to include everyone."
 - Examples of inclusive language: PEOPLE is always an acceptable substitute!
 FOLKS is a perennial favorite. And PATIENTS, where that makes sense.
- Coat hangers and references to "back alley abortions": Coat hanger images and
 "back alley abortions" imply that there are no longer safe abortion options and
 perpetuate abortion stigma. Medication abortion now accounts for a majority of early
 abortions, and you can be a part of the solution by elevating that option and spreading
 the word about self-managed abortions instead.
 - Some alternatives: lift up the work of local abortion providers Just the Pill (JustThePIll.com), Whole Woman's Health, WE Health Clinic, Robbinsdale Clinic, and Planned Parenthood Minnesota, or messages from the Reproductive Health Access Project (ReproductiveAccess.org) and Plan C Pills (PlanCPills.org)
- Handmaid's Tale imagery: This comparison centers fictional white folks and ignores the
 reality that many BIPOC communities have long been living in a world where their
 reproductive health decisions and outcomes have been wrongfully controlled, restricted
 and criminalized.
- References to forced sterilization: BIPOC people, including men, have been subject to forced sterilization for decades. The practice has a long, shameful history in the U.S. and

encouraging its deployment in response to the overturn of federal abortion rights is unhelpful and disrespectful.

Absolutely NO:

- **Sharia Law:** Barriers to abortion access are created by white supremacist, Christian fundamentalists; comparisons are inaccurate, racist, and anti-Muslim.
- Underground Railroad: Again, this is a culturally appropriative and inaccurate
 reference that is disrespectful to the legacy of escape from bondage. Abortion funds and
 practical support organizations, already exist to help people navigate getting abortion
 care. (See note about the Handmaid's Tale, above.)
